




JEREMIAH 31:31-34

¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For "no human being will be justified in the sight of God" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹ But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²² the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³ since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴ they are now justified by God's grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in divine forbearance God had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶ it was to prove at the present time that God is righteous and that God justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷ Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.



Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, we are bold to pray as Jesus taught us.


Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.



There is also a day in the week prior to bagging and distribution that the truck delivers items. There is a real need for at least 1 - 3 able bodied individuals to help unload the truck and stock the shelves and refrigerators. The delivery time varies, but it always takes place during the day. You would be notified in advance with the date and time of the delivery either via a text or email.
