November is the month when most people tend to list the things they are thankful for.

"Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" 1 Thessalonians 5:8.

Wait a second! Look at that verse again! Did you notice what that verse says? "Give thanks in ALL circumstances." So, does that mean I have to give thanks in those times when life isn't going like I planned it or when something bad happens? I hate to be the bearer of bad news but, yep, that is exactly what it means.

We all know that bad things are going to happen.
